

Our organization's balance at the close of 2014 was just a shade under \$13,000. Prior to last year, we had experienced a couple of down years that did a number on our finances. Around this time last year our budget committee made it a priority to put ENA on a financially sus-



tainable path, and we made changes where we could. We cut back on Echo publications and set an aggressive goal for our upcoming membership drive. Our membership drive met those goals, and then some. The combination of the successful membership drive, our leaner expenses, and a well-attended Fourth of July event resulted in the banner year we just experienced. The upcoming year will tell us if that improvement can be sustained, or if it was temporary. If temporary, then we can simply relish in the fact that it took us just one year to recover from our low. If it is sustainable, then perhaps we can start to consider what else we as a neighborhood can do. In my six or so years in the neighborhood. I have already seen a lot of change, from the annual growth of the Turkey Trot to the establishment of a successful community garden. With our neighborhood's 50th anniversary approaching in a few



years, I'd like to think there is a lot more we can accomplish. Thanks to each and every one of you who made last year a success!

By going door-to door in 2014, the number of member households increased from 343 to **445**; a whopping **29.7%.** So, it's very clear to the ENA Board that a door-to-door membership drive is well worth the effort.

Please consider joining the team by becoming a Block Captain for the ENA Membership Drive May 1-31, 2015. We will do our best to make sure you are knocking on doors of neighbors near you. Your job is as simple as dropping off a membership packet and asking the household to consider joining Elvehjem Neighborhood Association. Most Block Captains complete their assignment in an afternoon or two and often involve the whole family, including furry friends! A brief, low-key training will be provided on Saturday, April 11, from 9-9:30 a.m. at Messiah Lutheran Church.

Update on the Amendment to the **ENA Articles of Incorporation** For 501(c)(3) Tax-Exempt Status By ENA Director at Large Betsy Winterhack

In the last Echo, we asked ENA members to cast their vote on a proposed amendment to our Articles of Incorporation. The amendment is necessary for ENA to apply for 501(c)(3) tax exempt status.

ENA membership stepped up en masse! We received 141 electronic and paper ballots. 139 members voted to approve the amendment, with two members voting against it. Our next step is to file our amended Articles with the State Department of Financial Institutions and make our new language official. Thanks to all who made their mark on the future of our neighborhood association.

Mayor's Neighborhood Conference: Get Off the Sidelines and Into the Game

On September 13, 2014, five residents of Elvehjem Neighborhood attended the Mayor's Neighborhood Conference at the Monona Terrace to connect with City officials and neighborhood leaders, attend informational sessions, gather ideas, and get inspired by what has worked in other areas of the city and beyond. Key themes highlighted were capacity building, fostering racial equity in neighborhoods, building civic infrastructure, neighborhoods for people, and growing neighborhood businesses and food systems. Workshops featuring local neighborhood leaders provided valuable information about successful projects and important lessons learned.

In almost all cases, no matter the subject, the overall theme of the conference was to <u>GET OFF THE SIDELINES</u> and <u>INTO THE GAME</u> in any way, shape, or form that you can. Consider joining the neighborhood association, volunteering at a neighborhood event, engaging in a discussion or movement you are passionate about or one that may affect you or your family, or frequenting a local business you enjoy and telling others about it.

A question that comes up often during our monthly board meetings is, "How do we keep/get people engaged in the neighborhood?" It's very easy these days to "status" the things that bother us, "share" the ideas we like, and "comment" with our opinions. The reality is that it takes real action by humans to create change and real action by humans to maintain the current state. 


