Greetings! As you are likely aware Madison Metro will be undergoing a restructure of service in 2023. The recently released Transit Network Redesign Draft Plan focuses on fewer routes that are more direct and frequent, while providing coverage where it is needed most.

Are internet issues weighing you down? One of the issues identified by a broadband access task force are inaccurate service coverage maps. Residents are encouraged to complete an approximately <u>2 minute speed test</u>.

Data from the test results will help present a more complete picture of access issues and be used to expand access. In addition, virtual public hearings will be held in the near future. FYI: NO MOW MAY

Dan here. Some of your neighbors' grass might be a bit longer in early spring... this is why.

I went to the PBS Garden Expo at the Alliant Energy Center on February 12th and attended a seminar on "No Mow May" that I thought many of my Elvehjem neighbors might be curious to learn about. Article adapted from <u>WRN.com</u>.

No Mow May (NMM) is something you may want to consider for your yard this year. Official NMM Communities (of which Madison is not yet a member) suspend enforcement of long-grass ordinances for the month of May. This allows owners to promote a pollinator-friendly habitat early in the growing season.

"It's kind of like 'no shave November' for your yard," said Mark Konlok, Director of Horticulture at <u>Green Bay Botanical Garden</u>, who explains that bees and other pollinators can really benefit from leaving it be.

"And when we mow our lawn, if we have weeds and other things like that in there, we cut off all those flowers. Even dandelions are used by these newly emerging insects," Konlok said.

<u>Appleton adopted No Mow May in 2020</u>, and was joined in 2021 by De Pere, Fort Atkinson, Fox Crossing, Hortonville, Kau-kauna, Oshkosh, Stevens Point and Wausau.

Konlok said that in addition to being good for beneficial insects, NMM can encourage us to think about our lawns.

"And start to think about, maybe we should transition some of that lawn to more plants, maybe native plants or things we don't spend so much resources, time, energy, carbon dioxide, emissions, mowing, and maybe transition our yard to more of a habitat than just a turf grass area."

When Appleton adopted NMM last year, increases in bee populations and diversity were documented in the yards of participants.





A word from County Executive Joe Parisi

We may be in the first few months of the New Year, but Dane County's effort to embrace clean, green renewable energy is already set to reach a significant milestone in 2022. In a matter of months, Dane County will be the first public entity of its size in the region to power its facilities with 100% renewable electricity. This means Dane County government will produce more renewable energy than the total amount of electricity it consumes for its operations.

Through a partnership with Alliant Energy and SunVest Solar, construction is slated to begin this spring on a 90-acre solar farm on county land near our renewable natural gas production facility off Highway 12. When complete, this project will generate over 17 megawatts of electricity, enough energy to power 3,100 homes per year. The renewable electricity generated from this new project will reduce greenhouse gas emissions in an amount equivalent to the emissions produced by over 4,000 vehicles or the burning of 14,000 tons of coal per year.

Dane County currently receives about 45% of its electricity from renewable sources. The new installation – combined with our 9-megawatt solar project with MGE at the Dane County Regional Airport and nearly 20 other solar installations at county facilities – will push us to our goal of achieving 100% renewable electricity status. This milestone has been years in the making and will mark significant progress in our ongoing effort to combat climate change.

Simply put: if we want to move the dial on the climate crisis, this kind of work cannot wait.




