#### ALDER CURRIE'S COLUMN: BY JAEL CURRIE

Greetings friends & neighbors - I hope you and yours are staying as well as possible during the change of seasons and impending holiday months. I'd like to provide some information & updates about the Men's Homeless Shelter changes for this edition. As we enter seasons of caring (aka holidays), please keep an open mind and heart towards those who are experiencing homelessness. As a reminder, please feel free to reach out to me - district 16@cityofmadison.com - if you'd like to discuss additional issues, solutions or get questions about city business answered.

- Shelter operations successfully moved to the current temporary site at 2002 Zeier Rd. on 10/13/22.
- Hundreds have already made use of this new site with daily numbers trending between 150-200 guests per night. This number is significantly higher than the pre-COVID average numbers of 60-70 guests. The Zeier site can accommodate up to 250 people!
- Shelter services including intake, case management, and meals are available between the hours of 5pm-8am daily. There are also accommodations for those who are ill & require isolation and/or need medical attention. Shuttle transportation is provided daily between the shelter and The Beacon (Day Resource Center).
- While the current shelter model is night-by-night, the city's plans to open a permanent, purpose built men's shelter on Bartillon Dr. by mid-2025, are on track. This permanent site will offer longer term support (ie: on site services for housing navigation, case management, community resources and treatment options, offer pay to stay housing options and more).
- Work has already begun to solicit feedback from various groups to help inform decisions about the future site. The first focus groups include:
  - Persons who have experienced homelessness
  - Service providers and other community stakeholders that work with unhoused populations
  - People who live, own or operate businesses near the area the shelter is planned to be built
- Funding proposals to support the efforts at Zeier Rd. and the future development at Bartillon Dr. have been collaboratively included in both the City and County's 2023 Capital & Operating Budgets, which I support.

### **GIVEAWAY! 4 Free Compost Bins**

The Elvehiem Neighborhood Association has an exciting opportunity for its residents. The City of Madison Streets Division has gifted the ENA four new covered compost bins, each worth \$60. The bins are 3 feet by 3 feet, with a collapsed height of 4 inches. We are doing a random-draw giveaway for these bins, limit one per household.

Composting can reduce food and other organic waste. It is good for the environment and provides rich fertilizer for growing healthy produce or beautiful flowers. You can compost in as little as three square feet (the size of our bins) of outdoor space, on a flat site with good drainage. These closed compost bins control odor and are unobtrusive in a vard.

Act quickly so you will be ready for spring composting!

### **Big Brothers Big Sisters**


Statistics show that children with a mentor have higher success rates in school, have better relationships with peers and family, and are more likely to avoid risky behaviors.


