ALDER CURRIE'S COLUMN: BY JAEL CURRIE

Greetings friends and neighbors,

I hope this message finds you well! The following are updates about what I've been working on most recently:

2024 Budget Prep and Approval

As shared in the last newsletter, I had been working to grow my understanding and knowledge of outstanding projects and needs, considering the anticipated budget constraints. I chose to focus my efforts in the following areas: affordable housing & homeless service funding allocations, violence prevention efforts, and traffic engineering/safety. I'm pleased to share an amendment I put forward with Alder Field (D3) to provide funding for apartment communities at/near risk of public nuisance declaration was unanimously passed by the Finance Committee and will be presented to the Council for final vote when budget deliberations begin next week, Tuesday 11/14.



Budget prep this year has involved significant collaboration with the County Board of Supervisors. The County Board just passed their 2024 budgets this week which included significant funding towards basic humans needs such as affordable housing, violence prevention and the opportunity to expand CARES outside the City of Madison. Of significance for D16 is significant support to continue the operation of the Dairy Drive Sheltered Campground.

Violence Prevention, Stabilization and Collaboration efforts

I have continued working closely with MPD, Public Health's Violence Prevention Unit and KCG on abating the nuisance activity at The Meadowlands. Part of that work included getting formal partnerships with a collective of local social service providers who are now on-site at The Meadowlands, and are hoping to expand these services to The Harmony Apartments. I have also attended and participated in several youth focused listening sessions, as youth have been at the center of recent gun violence and concerning incidents in the area.

There is a lot more happening but only so much space here. Please be on the lookout for a new blog from me as well as sharing of information on social media. As always, please contact me at district 16@cityofmadison.com with additional questions or needs.

2023 ELVEHJEM SURVEY RESULTS

As mentioned in the President's Letter, the ENA recently finished gathering feedback from you and your fellow neighbors via both our annual Membership Drive and online collection between April and October. Below are the highlights and findings that we will use to inform our future efforts as an Association.

- **Total respondents:** 300 (representing ~20% of Elvehjem households)
- There were a variety of respondents, but the **median** was a female homeowner, age 60+, who has lived in Elvehjem for 20+ years. Consider this when interpreting the results.
- 90% of respondents read the quarterly **Echo** and 76% read the monthly **Extra** e-newsletter.
- 65% of respondents do NOT attend ENA **events**, citing age, immobility, busyness, and "not having kids" as primary factors. In 2024 we're aiming to appeal to ALL residents with our events, not just those with young families.
- ENA events rated in order of **most-enjoyed**: July 4th Celebration, Turkey Trot, Holiday in the Park, Annual Meeting, Egg Hunt
- 58% of respondents **gather** with their neighbors occasionally or often. 37% socialize **outside** of the neighborhood with their neighbors occasionally or often.
- Our Schools, Parks, and Safety & Public Service all rate favorably among respondents while Transit leaves the most room for improvement.

- Ask your carrier to place packages in an area out of plain view.
- Have packages delivered to your work.
- Schedule delivery for times you will be home.
- Track your packages by signing up for alerts.
