Vote on Proposed Bylaw Changes at the March 15 Annual Membership Meeting

The ENA Bylaws Committee has been hard at work bringing the Association's bylaws up to date. Similar to other organizations, ENA's bylaws are rules intended to provide a framework for the Association's functions and activities. The last update to the bylaws was in 2004. The primary motivation to draft the latest updates was to bring the bylaws in line with the Association's current practices. The updates are also intended to make sure the bylaws are as clear as possible and use proper terminology.

In order to go into effect, the updates must be approved by two-thirds of those voting at the Annual Membership Meeting. Treasurer's Corner

This time of year is fairly guiet in terms of Treasurer's Reports. The last few months of 2013 saw a handful of membership dues payments, and the printing and mailing expenses for the November/December issue of the Echo. We have, however, started the process of preparing a budget for 2014, which will be submitted for approval at the annual meeting in March. The Budget Committee, which met in November, recommended a modest increase in the dues amount, which the Board approved, from \$12 annually to \$15. Reduced dues for those paying at the Annual Meeting will remain at \$10. It was a difficult decision for us to make, but in the end it was necessary. Membership dues are our primary source of revenue, yet the number of dues-paying households continues to decline. ENA has already reduced our main expense, the cost of publishing the Echo, by limiting publication to six issues per year, down from ten. While that limits the Board's ability to communicate directly with our neighbors, it became necessary after consecutive years of significant financial losses. In the end, our goal is to be zero-profit, zero-loss, and to continue sponsoring great neighborhood events throughout the year without risking the longterm sustainability of the association. We hope that no further cuts will be necessary, and that starts with our members. When our membership drive starts up again this March, please consider joining ENA. To those who have year-in and year-out supported our mission by joining—some even by sponsoring us with additional donations—thank you. We couldn't do it without you.



SANITARY SEWER SERVICE LINE WARRANTY PROGRAM

Homeowners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of the private sewer service line that extends from their home to the point where the line connects to the public sewer mains under the street. Most homeowners insurance **does not cover** this repair.

In the past, if this line was damaged, the City of Madison would repair the line at a fixed cost of \$4,500 and offer homeowners a 5 year payment plan to cover the cost of the repair.

Wisconsin Act 32 now prohibits the City from performing construction work on private property. Instead, the homeowner will have to hire a private contractor to do the repair. Depending on the extent of damage the costs could easily exceed \$4.500.

A Sewer Line Warranty Program is now available to City of Madison homeowners to provide up to \$10,000 of insurance to help offset the expense of repairing a sewer line failure. Premiums for the insurance can be paid monthly or annually.

The insurance is optional. Homeowners are <u>not</u> required to buy it. However, it is recommended that you consider the age of your home and sewer line, the number and type of trees above the sewer line and any history of previous damage and/or severe sewer line blockage when making your decision.

Elvehjem Neighborhood Wooden Steps Running Club Logs 3000+ Miles in 2013

The Elvehjem Neighborhood Association "Wooden Steps" Running Club has been meeting since December 2010, and during our first year, we logged **1094.99 miles**, which kept us stateside, as we ran the equivalent of the distance from Madison to just past Dallas, Texas.

In 2012, we headed to the land down under and logged **2,568 miles**, equivalent to crossing the continent of Australia from east to west. In 2013, we ventured to South America and ran **3076.58 miles**, just over the distance from Caracas, Venezuela, to Santiago, Chile. Next year, we have our sights set on an African safari, as we hope to log **4000 miles** and cross the continent from north to south, running from Libya to South Africa. In 2014, we'd also like to encourage walkers to join the fun, so we are in need of a leader to coordinate weekly walks. Neighborhood Watch Exploratory Meeting Held

On October 12th the Elvehjem Neighborhood Association (ENA) conducted a meeting to explore the possibility of a neighborhood initiative for a neighborhood watch. This meeting was attended by three board members and eight neighbors not on the ENA board. There were also two neighbors interested but were not able to attend the meeting as scheduled. The meeting included a presentation of what a neighborhood watch is and is not, review of national neighborhood watch documents and guidelines and questions and answers about how to implement a watch in the Elvehjem neighborhood. At the end of the presentation, there was a call for the neighbors present to commit to further work on establishing and working on a watch initiative. Only three people were committed to working further on a watch.

I discussed the meeting with the ENA board on November 6. I also recommended that there was not enough interest to warrant additional commitment from the board to further a watch initiative at an ENA level. I recommended that if individuals wished to organize on a smaller level with a few neighbors, that is certainly possible, however a watch under the auspices of the ENA was not realistic due to the small number of people expressing interest at the meeting. Therefore, the board decided not to pursue an ENA neighborhood watch at this time. If there is any further interest by other neighbors in the future, this matter may be considered again.

The Madison Police Department's Crime Prevention Office have developed what they call the "Nine House Model" concept for getting to know and watch out for your neighbors. This resource is defined as:

The Nine House Model involves the homes that are within your natural line-eye sight; the homes you see when you are at home. Envision a tic-tac-toe board. Your home is the free space (x). Numbers 1,2, and 3 are behind yours; numbers 4 and 6 are your side yard neighbors; and 7,8, and 9 are across the street. By exchanging contact infor-

mation with these neighbors, you will have enhanced a perimeter of safety by expanding by 8 the number of eyes and ears around your home.
