Secretary's Corner By Jamie Meise

This month's Secretary's Corner features a guest author, our District 16 Alder Denise DeMarb, with important updates on Elvehjem Neighborhood issues.

From the Desk of Denise DeMarb, District 16 Alder

Dear Elvehjem Neighbors,

Together with Elvehjem leadership, there are four specific items I have been working on for you:

1) New Playground Equipment at Droster Park: If you have had the opportunity to travel past Droster Park, you will be delighted to see Madison Parks' work on new play-ground equipment. Playground equipment is on a rotation for replacement, and Droster came to the top of the list this year. Parks held a couple of meetings over the winter where neighbors were invited to choose between options of playground equipment. We were even able to add in some natural features to the playground area. Come play and enjoy!

2) Quarry Blasting: In response to emails I received concerning the strength of the blasting from Yahara Quarry, I coordinated a meeting to understand legal jurisdiction governing guarries. Last month, Alder Cnare and I hosted a meeting with Homberg, Yahara, Wingra (Quarries); County Board Supervisors; State Representatives; and Neighborhood Leadership. I understood from that meeting that guarries reside under state mining laws, which supersede any and all City ordinance(s). These particular quarries have existed for approximately 40 years, even before current law, so they operate under grandfather clauses. They have elected to follow current law but are not technically mandated to do so. They are monitored, and their seismographs are tested and calibrated on a regular basis. All blasts have fallen within the boundaries of permitable blasts. I understand this doesn't help your experience of the blasts. I have worked with Madison Fire Department and have set up a second meeting with the guarries to talk about process/procedure for recording complaints. More to come ...

3) Dump Trucks on East Buckeye Road: In response to emails I received stating concern about dump trucks speeding on Buckeye, I contacted Yahara Quarry. I have emailed with Tim Gagon, and he has talked to the employees of Yahara and businesses Yahara contracts with for gravel/cement delivery. Mr. Gagon told me all dump truck drivers have been told to monitor their speed on Buckeye. I asked Mr. Gagon if they would consider using an alternate route, traveling east on AB and using Femrite or 12/18 to travel to Stoughton Rd. He informed me that AB is a truck route, it is the shortest distance (which it is as I checked it out myself), and therefore is the least amount of cost to the quarry. It is not their intention to change the route. AB is a county road and is a designated truck route; therefore, they are under no "obligation" to change their route. I was hopeful they would understand safety concerns of neighbors and act as a "great neighbor;" unfortunately, at this time, that is not possible. I also spoke with Captain Schauf of the East Madison Police

District and Scott Langer from City Traffic Engineering Department. A traffic study has been ordered as a means of gathering baseline data, to understand numbers of vehicles, time, direction, and speed of travel. Unfortunately, the counters cannot measure weight, so we have no way of differentiating heavy from light vehicles. Once the baseline data is gathered, we will have a clear indication of what we are dealing with, and police may have further involvement with ticketing traffic on AB. Hopefully, Mr. Gagon's communication with the drivers/companies will have a positive effect. More to come....

4) **Mowing the Acewood Bike Path:** Tiff Roltgen, Elvehjem Neighborhood President, contacted me to ask if I could help with "cleaning up" the bike path for the Elvehjem Fourth of July Celebration. The grass was growing over the path and she was hoping to have it trimmed for runners. Parks said they would have someone come before the celebration and trim the path. Unfortunately, the person who came to trim brought a large tractor/ mower and mowed the entire area, destroying the beauty of the path and habitat for the creatures that lived there. It is horribly sad that this happened. Parks is well aware of the mishap and has spoken to the employee. I spoke with Parks, and they apologize for this error; unfortunately this will not bring back the beauty of the path for this season.

Madison is great City! Thank you for allowing me serve. Stay well and enjoy the remainder of your summer.


4th Annual Firecracker 5K a Blazing Success!
