So this year we decided to expand it to Neighborhood Week Out. Join in the fun August 2 - 8 by hosting an event and inviting your neighbors, attending a neighbor's event, or even just walking the neighborhood and taking the opportunity to get to

know each other a little better. Good neighbors make safer communities! And don't forget to mark your calendars for the Taste of Elvehjem on September 13, a garden-fresh potluck at the Elvehjem Community Garden with prizes awarded to the best (healthy) recipes, as well as garden tours and activities for kids.

TREASURER'S REPORT


With \$1,880 received year-to-date in Echo newsletter advertising income, we continue to do significantly better than the prior year and budget. However, at the time this report was submitted, membership income is down about \$1,750 dollars from last year and budget. We currently have 317 out of 1,726 total households signed up for 2015; our goal was to sign up 500 households, so if you haven't done so, please help support your neighborhood by becoming a member for only \$15 per year. Join online today at www.elvehjemneighborhood.org/join. Once again, we had a successful 4th of July Celebration netting about \$1,160, which is up about \$50 from the prior year. Overall expenses are down about \$355 from the prior year; these savings are from a reduction in the cost of printing and mailing the Echo newsletter, mainly due to increased numbers of neighbors choosing to receive their Echo via email. We continue to have a strong cash position of about \$18,000, which is up about \$3,000 from the previous year.



Recap: 2015 Membership Drive

Madison Night Out Winner

Congratulations to Kathleen Brandenburg, our neighbor on Bay Ridge Road, who was the winner of our "Madison Night Out" drawing. All households who were current in their membership by the end of May 2015 were included in the prize drawing, which included a \$50 gift card to the Great Dane and a "Paint and Sip" package for two (\$70 value) to Artful Escapes in Fitchburg. Both of these prizes were generously donated by the respective establishments in support of our membership drive.

The Final Numbers

Our 2015 membership drive was unable to replicate last year's success as we have fallen well short of the previous count of 434 households, despite our ambitious goal of reaching 500. To date, we have received membership dues from 330 households in the neighborhood. Total membership dues and donations received were \$6,876 – a 17 percent drop from last year. Thanks to donations above and beyond the \$15 annual dues, the annual amount received per household exceeded \$20, which is up slightly from last year. We are tremendously grateful to all who made the commitment to support our Elvehjem Neighborhood Association.

Many thanks to our district coordinators, block captains, and of course, all of our neighbors, for making our neighborhood the great place that it is!
