Treasurer's Report

The association's finances are sound especially after the annual membership drive has now wrapped up. Four hundred forty households have signed up for an annual membership for a total of \$9,584, which is up \$2400 from last year. Thanks to all neighbors who have showed their support through their membership. Every dollar is appreciated as it is the organizations primary

source of funding. Overall income is up this year by about \$1,000 as compared to last year at the same time. Expenses are up about \$1,000 as well. This increase in expenses is due to increased cost of mailing the Echo newsletters to more neighbors, as in the past it was not mailed to apartment complex residents. Elvehjem currently has a strong cash balance at \$24,000 which is up \$6,000 over the prior year. It is good to see the cash balance growing heading into the neighborhood association's 50th Anniversary year in 2018.

As part of the preparations the board reviewed prize donations received from our many neighborhood supporters in preparation for the raffle drawing and silent auction. A Note From Your Alder, Denise DeMarb

Madison summer means road construction and as you know Cottage Grove Road (CGR) is seriously impacted! Of course road construction brings inconvenience, but this project will be a big enhancement to our corridor and help all modes of transportation move safely. I have received many emails with concerns of safe passage on and across CGR. I am pleased to report pedestrian crossings will be installed at Flora, Meadowlark and Thompson and bumpered bike lanes will offer safe passage for those residents taking 2 wheels instead of four. Of course other important reasons for this work is to improve the road way for vehicles. The project will also replace the water main between Stoughton and Ellen and the sewer main and laterals between Stoughton and Flora. The project is on schedule and should be completed by

October.

I have engaged the City to perform a CGR corridor study. City plans show CGR as a shopping street, but it is not zoned accordingly. The work is scheduled to start this fall and there will be public meetings held to further explain the project and gain your input.

AND I'm proud of my tireless work to help ensure our neighborhoods stay strong. The City will be announcing a new housing program this fall. This program will help ensure our neighborhoods have a good balance of owner occupied homes and will serve future generations.

Madison's own



Energy 2030: Building a Community Energy Company for the Future From: Madison Gas and Electric

Throughout this past year, MGE has asked our customers to think deeply about the issues surrounding providing electricity to our community. We asked for input, and many answered the call. Hundreds of our customers participated in what we call Community Energy Conversations. Hosted by an independent professional facilitator, Justice and Sustainability Associates, nearly 100 small-group discussions took place across our community at various locations and times for anyone who wanted to take part. The intimate and inclusive sessions, which were extended several weeks to accommodate all requests to participate, encouraged thoughtful, open-ended dialogue.

Those who participated in the Conversations rated them highly. Customers also had the opportunity to share comments with us online. In addition to the Community Energy Conversations, MGE enlisted the expertise of a Wisconsin-based professional market research firm to survey a statistically valid random sample of customers. The survey was undertaken to enhance MGE's understanding of customers' energy goals and priorities.

We also collaborated and continue to do so with representatives from numerous community stakeholder groups such as, for example, the Citizens Utility Board and Clean Wisconsin, both energy experts in Wisconsin.

On April 19, 2016, more than 200 community leaders and members, representing a diverse cross section of interests and perspectives, attended MGE's Community Energy Workshop at Monona Terrace for deliberative dialogue about our energy future. Participants discussed and generated input on three topics: how to advance MGE's Energy 2030 framework; how to address customer needs through new products and services; and, how to further MGE's ongoing community engagement efforts.

The guidance generated by workshop participants will inform how MGE implements its long-term framework. With 146, 000 electric customers who have different needs, concerns and priorities, MGE will advance areas of common interest into the future through many different collaborations and partnerships. The summary of themes report and the three videos presented at the workshop are available online at mge.com/workshop. We encourage customers to review the full range of information and share their thoughts with us by email through our website. Under Energy 2030, MGE will continue to work with our community to reduce carbon dioxide emissions 40% from 2005 levels by 2030 and increase our use of renewable resources to 30% of electric sales by 2030. As a milestone goal, we've pledged to reach 25% renewables by 2025, which is consistent with the renewable energy goals of Madison, Middleton, Fitchburg, Monona and Dane County.

Broad and diverse community engagement is one of MGE's core principles as your community energy company. This relationship with our customers is more important than ever as we enter one of the most dynamic periods in the history of the energy industry. Safety, reliability, affordability—and sustainability—have been and continue to be MGE's top priorities. We know our customers share these goals and have reflected them in Energy 2030. What we, as a community energy company engaged with concerned customers, have been able to accomplish this past year is significant, but there is still work to do. Our Energy 2030 framework can only become a reality if we work together with our customers. As we develop specific initiatives, investments, programs, products and services for our future, we will look to customers for additional guidance and support. You are critical to helping us reach the Energy 2030 goals and to keeping our community a place we're all proud to call ours.
