SAFETY REVIEW

As we watch children in our neighborhood walking to and from school, it is again time to think about pedestrian and vehicular safety. Small children and vehicular traffic can combine to create dangerous situations. These, and other safety concerns were discussed in a recent interview with Madison police Safety Officer Ed Corcoran.

He offers four safety tips to motorists. "We urge motorists to motorists to reduce to reduce speed in or approaching school areas to 20 miles per hour. Motorists should be aware of children on their way to and from school and be alert at crossings protected by sdult crossing guards and school safety particls." Off. Corcoran went on to encourage all drivers to, "be prepared to stop for school buses and bikers."

off. Corcoran said parents fac-ing the question of whether their child should be allowed to cross the street alone. Before making the street alone. Before making that decision he suggests parents become aware of the following child growth and development factors. First, a child's eyes are not fully developed. Vision is a key

factor in safety situations. Children lack peripheral vision (the ability to see to the sides) until about age seven and see one third less that than adult. "Children have difficulty judging depth of field (which object is closer) which makes it difficult for them to judge speed or distance," stated off. corcoran.

young children also have difficulty judging whether a car is coming or going, moving or standing still. Off. Corcoran then asked the question, "Did you ever see a child waiting for a car that was two blocks away?" Underdeveloped vision may be the reason.

Hearing skills are also a concern. Children are learning to pick out sounds and place meanings or risks on them. For example a chirping bird is registering as pleasant while a siren can mean danger. Children usually pick the (continued on page 3) factor in safety situations.
