



Dear Neighbors,

This is the time of year when we usually start thinking about summer vacations and planning to get together at BBQs, baseball games, big summer blockbusters, and trips to the pool. Last year the ENA Board was wrapping up our annual membership drive and preparing for what would be a wonderful 4th of July Celebration. Now fast forward to the present and so much of our lives and the ENA calendar have been flipped upside down. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, we have had to adapt and change our usual summer activities and events:

- The annual meeting will move to a virtual Zoom meeting where quorum will be met through video conferencing. The link will be posted on FB on June 3rd, following our monthly board meeting.
- The membership drive will happen online and through the mail with membership forms inside the *Echo* newsletter, including this one.
- The annual neighborhood garage sale event will be cancelled.
- Finally, in a tough decision, we have decided to cancel the annual 4th of July Celebration. As an alternative, I'm encouraging members to contact us about what they would want to see or ideas for socially-distant alternatives. Virtual bike parade? Online raffle? Let us know and we will be happy to facilitate.
- We are looking to sponsor a large neighborhood event in the fall or winter once the restrictions allow for larger gatherings. Think of an annual harvest festival, bonfire, or big Neighborhood Night Out. We will keep you informed on any event developments over the coming weeks and months.

As we find ourselves in a different situation this summer, we have an opportunity as an association to turn the disappointing into something positive and uplifting. In lieu of some of the expenses the association normally spends on events, the board has decided to donate \$500 of our budgeted event expenses to the River Food Pantry to help local families in need of food. Additionally, we will contribute \$5 dollars - up to \$500 more - for every person that joins the ENA by July 4th. This is a time for our neighborhood association to give back to our community. Elvehjem neighborhood has given to us over the last 10 years since we restarted the membership drive, and now it's time for us to give back the generosity.



GRAZING GOATS AT ACEWOOD CONSERVATION PARK

If you haven't heard yet, we'll be welcoming some unique visitors to the neighborhood this spring & summer.

What exactly is goat-ing on?

From Paul Quinlan (PQ) at Madison Parks: "We are developing Habitat Management Plans for all of Madison's conservation parks and will draft one for Acewood this year. This preliminary [cleanup] work is helping us assess the site and decide the best course of action to make this property as diverse and sustainable as we can."



Who is doing what, and when?

PQ: "Parks hired HaakHagen Goat Grazing LLC to follow-up and expand on work begun by our Operation Fresh Start crew this past winter. Meanwhile, we contacted Good Oak Ecological Services to help us begin to address the garlic mustard invasion at Acewood, and help us coordinate our next steps."

From Frank Hassler Jr. of Good Oak Ecological Services: "In late-June, goats will be brought in to conduct prescribed grazing on small brush and other weeds. Later, Good Oak Ecological Services will clear invasive brush that was too large for the goats to take down. The goats will return in mid-August so they can gnaw on brush resprouts and weeds again. Finally, Good Oak will return to clean-up remaining downed woody debris left over after the goats are done, leaving the area more open and ready for future management action."

Why goats?

PQ: "We evaluated the overwhelming amount of invasive species that need to be controlled, and realized that this site could be ideal for exploring methods that minimize the use of herbicides. Enter: goats. The site is relatively quiet, the brush is a good size, and the terrain makes it easy to install temporary fences for the goats here. We plan to control woody invasive species like buckthorn and honeysuckle with prescribed grazing over the next few years, slowly reducing their abundance."

Can we watch?

PQ: "The bike path will remain open while the goats are there, and people will easily be able to see the goats. We know this will inevitably turn into somewhat of an attraction, but want to let people know that they should be careful to stay quiet and not stress the goats by interacting with them. Relatedly, I should note that dogs are only allowed along the paved bike path, and not in the conservation park (the woods) per MGO 8.40. We plan to finally post signs and enforce this, so if people begin to comply now, it will be better for the goats when they get here."

Facts about goats:

- There will be about 40 goats on site, hard at work eating invasive species
- Adult goats weigh between 80-100 lbs where adolescents weigh about 20-30 lbs
- These goats belong to a local farmer who hires them out for land management purposes
- Goats eat an average of 8 lbs of vegetation while grazing between 12-16 hours per day
